

Morgan Challenge Race Series



The Morgan Challenge Race Series is a one-make race series for Morgan sportscars, sponsored by Aero Racing, the performance arm of the Morgan Motor Company, and supported by Yokohama Tyres.

It is open to all 4-wheeled Morgans and the championship is divided into several classes encompassing both standard and modified cars to encourage entries from as broad a spectrum of cars as possible. It is well known for being friendly, welcoming and supportive of both new and seasoned competitors. Grids throughout last season were well supported with an average of 27 cars.

There are 10 championship rounds with the best 8 to count towards the Championship positions. Points are awarded to class winners, second, third and so on, with an extra point being awarded for the fastest lap in each class. This enables a quick and consistent driver from any class to become overall champion and win the coveted Peter Collins Tray at the end of the season. It also ensures that, although the overall race winner is likely to come from the highly modified and very quick cars in class A or B, the battles for class honours throughout the field should be just as hotty contested.

CLASSES

Class A

Morgan Plus 8 – Modified up to 4.6 litre and max rpm 7500. Morgan Aero 8 - Standard production with N62 engines. Forced induction 4 cylinder max capacity 2000cc.

MOT not required.

Class B

Morgan Plus 8 – Modified up to 3999cc.
Morgan Plus 8 – Standard production 4.6 litre.
Morgan V6 Roadster – Modified up to 2999cc.
Morgan Plus 4 and 4/4 – modified up to 2350cc
normally aspirated.

Morgan Aero 8 - Standard production with M62 engines.

MOT not required.

Class C

Morgan Plus 8 - Standard production up to 3999cc.

Class D

Morgan Plus 8 – Standard production carburetted up to 3612cc.

Class E

Morgan 4 cylinder cars, MOT not required.

Class F

Morgan Plus 8 "Roadsports" – 1968 - 1979 up to 3612cc.

Class R

Morgan V6 Roadster - Standard production up to 2999cc.

Class I

Morgan Invitation – Morgan cars not eligible for the
Championship which have been individually approved by the
Technical Committee.

The Drivers

There are 45 registered competitors in the series: several have been racing in the Challenge since it began in 1985 and some are new drivers, either novices to the sport or who have migrated from other forms of motor sport or other race series. Some competitors drive to the circuit in their race cars on the day of the event, some overnight in a local B&B and others bring their cars on trailers behind motor homes. The variety of competitors is wide, both in age and occupations and we also currently have three lady drivers. The only qualifications you will need are to be enthusiastic and sporting; commitment ranges from fiercely competitive to laid-back. The Morgan racing fraternity is one of the most friendly race series around and if anyone has a problem with their car there is always a helping hand.
